* Based on national law and not on EU law some EU Member States grant more protection to a national trademark registration than to a CTM. Ex.: a national Italian registration covers San Marino and Vatican, but a CTM doesn't.

** Based on national UK law and not on EU law CTMs are recognized in the Isle of Man and Jersey. Extension of a CTM may be applied for in the Cayman Islands. Extension of a CTM is automatic in the Falkland Islands where the mark is also registered in the UK.
